This site has evolved and will keep doing so. That is the way hypermedia works -- it is not like a book but it 'lives'. At the beginning there were cars. One has to start somewhere. Then came trucks, motorcycles, tractors, tanks and whatnot. All have one thing in common: they are vehicles.

Looking at the definition given for 'vehicle' in Wikipedia (English section) it starts with, I quote, 'Vehicles are nonliving means of transportation. They are most often man-made (e.g. bicycles, cars, motorcycles, trains, ships, and aircraft), although some other means of transportation which are not made by man can also be called vehicles; examples include icebergs and floating tree trunks.

I think we can exclude the icebergs and floating tree trunks. $\ensuremath{\heartsuit}$



I would reduce it further to land vehicles that can move freely, i.e. need no tracks like trains and trams. This also excludes anything floating or flying. Furthermore I would exclude anything without an engine; so out go bicycles and tricycles and all carriages drawn by horses or other beasts of burden.

That leaves self powered human controlled motorised vehicles


The oldest would be those from Nicolas-Joseph Cugnot (first truck) and Richard Trevithick (first bus) long before the first petrol car or bike from Benz, Daimler, Maybach or Marcus. And it ends, well, wherever you like it: Cadillac or Land-Rover, Cagiva or Lambretta, Caterpiller or Lanz, Chausson or Leyland, ...

I would say, add a vehicle if you think it fits into this site (possibly with a name). And if you are unsure add it into the comments. That is a good place for all those vehicles (in the definition's sense) that could interest others visiting this site.

In the end this site is for us AND a few dozen (hundert, thousand) visitors. Therefore for me my own rule is to add films that are interesting for me and to try to use good quality images and (hopefully) useful comments.

Of course there are obvious differences but consider the similarities (relative to listing): both are electric, neither are road vehicles, neither have lights or any other road equipment. I simply don't understand why the Forklift is more acceptable for listing than the thing here. I am new to the site and am trying to understand the rules and criteria. -- Last edit: 2006-02-26 18:11:57 antp That's hard to define. But as I said there is a quite big different in their size. The electric chair (what I call that thing) is juste like wheelchairs, but with an added electric motor. A forklift is more like a real vehicle, I do not think that all of them are electric (I thought that they used petrol, by 2006-02-26 18:21 the way). And if I am correct, some can get a license plate (well, I am nearly sure that I already saw some with a license plate, in Belgium). There is the same problem for trolley-busses: according to what is said above, they should not be listed here since they are not as free as a bus. They are more like trams... Forklifts have various engines/motors - petrol, natural gas, propane, electric and come in all sizes from small hand driven pallet movers to large 50 ton lifters.
